I vote for making your own. They cost about 1/3 the price of the name brands. Here's how to do it:

Trust me, they don't even come close (in every measurable way). And if you are looking for something to last in the long run you are easily losing money. I have shot a single **Firenock** over 1000 times (into a cedar bale) and it still works perfectly. Try that with a homemade nock. The ones I used/tried (and I had alot) lasted maybe 100 shots into cedar bales, generally less. So basically, times what it costs to make the homemade nocks by 10 and then you could compare prices.

A few more reasons why **Firenock** is superior... They are at least 8-10 times brighter then homemade nocks (about 3-4 times brighter then Lumenok) and with a single battery they last about 30 hours of being on continuously. That means forever if you are shooting them and turning them off if 30 seconds. Not to mention you can easily change the battery or the nock itself whenever they wear out. The nocks weigh 27 grains with almost no weight variance. Not 32+ grains with a variance of 3-4 grains. And trust me there are alot of other reasons why they are better. It took me 2 years to find them after trying every other option out there. There is no doubt they are the best. And this is coming from a guy that pays \$18 per nock.
