I have been using Lumenocks for a while, but read a review on Archery Talk on how good the Firenocks were. Seeing as how I had everything I needed for my bow, I ordered a set of Firenocks for my Maxima Hunters. The batteries were relatively easy to install, but getting the wire around the battery took a little patience. Off to the range. The first thing I noticed was they were very bright.

They performed flawlessly and I even used them on the 3d course at dusk, just because it was fun. Turning them off was easy also. I am not sure how long the nock will last dropping them on it every time to turn them off. I will probably order a set of target style that turn off automatically after 15 seconds. I really liked not having to slide them in and out of the arrow to turn them off. Overall, they are pretty well designed. On about the second day, I did have a problem with one of them not turning on, but the next day it was fine. Not sure what the deal was.

One of them rattled in my quiver when I shot, so maybe a little bigger O ring to keep things in place might help.

Also, I was not able to group the practice nocks with the Firenocks. It may be my bow was a little out of tune, but the Firenocks pretty much hit just a little below my regular arrows.

Overall, I was pleased with them and I will be using them for hunting this fall.

Note: One can always shot the Firenock again to shut it off for practice if nock deform is a concern. Firenock's nock is field changeable. The battery supplier cannot keep the tolerance as tight as we would like, that is why some of the battery with a deeper grove would cause sound in those occasion as the O-ring cannot pick up the slack leave by a deeper grove.
