I have only tried a few different lighted arrow nocks in the past 2 years of my hunting career. I used the lumenocks my first year only to be shocked to find out they worked when they wanted to.

After a failed attempt with them I tried making my own lighted nocks. They worked great, but the only thing with homemade nocks is that they didn't seem to fly very straight for me compared to my normal arrows.

This past summer I picked up 3 firenocks and gave them a try. All I can say is that I was amazed with them. They were extremely bright and would stay lit for a long time. I wasn't able to use them on a live animal so I didn't get to experiment with the ease of finding them after shooting an animal, but from my experience with these is that they are very dependable and very bright. I didn't shoot them a lot when practicing because I wanted to save them for hunting season so I didn't get to test the battery life of them as I did several short shooting sessions (you must try these at night if you have a setup that you can shoot SAFELY in the dark.) There is only one real con I noticed with them, and that is that they are fairly expensive. Another small con is the weight, but you will have increased weight no matter which lighted nock you use (lost about 2-3 fps). The saying runs very true with these lighted nocks in "you get what you pay for."

My recommendation to the people out there is to give these a try, they are well worth the price to at least try them. If you had past disappointments with other lighted nocks, I can assure you that you won't be disappointed with these.
